

Message from Board Chair and CEO

2020 was a challenging year for people across our country and around the world.

In Newfoundland and Labrador, it was a difficult year for our communities and our YMCA. In response, we adopted the goal to persevere to provide sustainable, relevant, and impactful service to our communities during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Through careful management, support from three levels of government, and charitable giving, we are proud that we have been able to both sustain the organization and serve our communities in new ways. YMCA NL provided child care to children of essential workers, shifted our Employment, Enterprise, and Newcomer Services to remote delivery province-wide, and added capacity to provide food and personal hygiene items to international students and seniors on the Burin and Avalon Peninsulas. When, under reduced capacity, we were able to re-open our health fitness and aquatics centres after being closed for four months we followed strict guidelines to be a healthy, safe place for people to exercise.

In 2021 we will continue to persevere. We look forward to continuing to grow into new communities. Our Employment, Enterprise, and Newcomer programs will expand again, the new Central Labrador YMCA in Happy Valley-Goose Bay will open, and our regulated child care programs for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers will shift to the province's \$25/day operating grant program.

We know our communities will need us more than ever, and sometimes in ways we cannot yet imagine. We will work to raise for funds for the YMCA financial assistance program, make new partnerships, and develop new programs. We will also focus on ensuring we operate as efficiently as sustainably as possible.
