

## How to work in Regulated Child Care (Canadian Citizen, Permanent Resident, and Student Visa)

- You must be **18 years or older** to work in regulated child care. If you are a soon-to-be or recent high school graduate interested in working in Early Childhood Education, reach out to your local college or university to start your enrollment.
- You must be enrolled or on a waitlist from a recognized Early Childhood Education program to obtain a Trainee certification from AECENL.
- If you are a work/study permit holder, you must be cleared to work with children as indicated on your temporary work permit.
- You must be able to obtain an acceptable Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Sector Check from the RNC or RCMP; have Standard First Aid; be able to obtain your Immunization Records.
